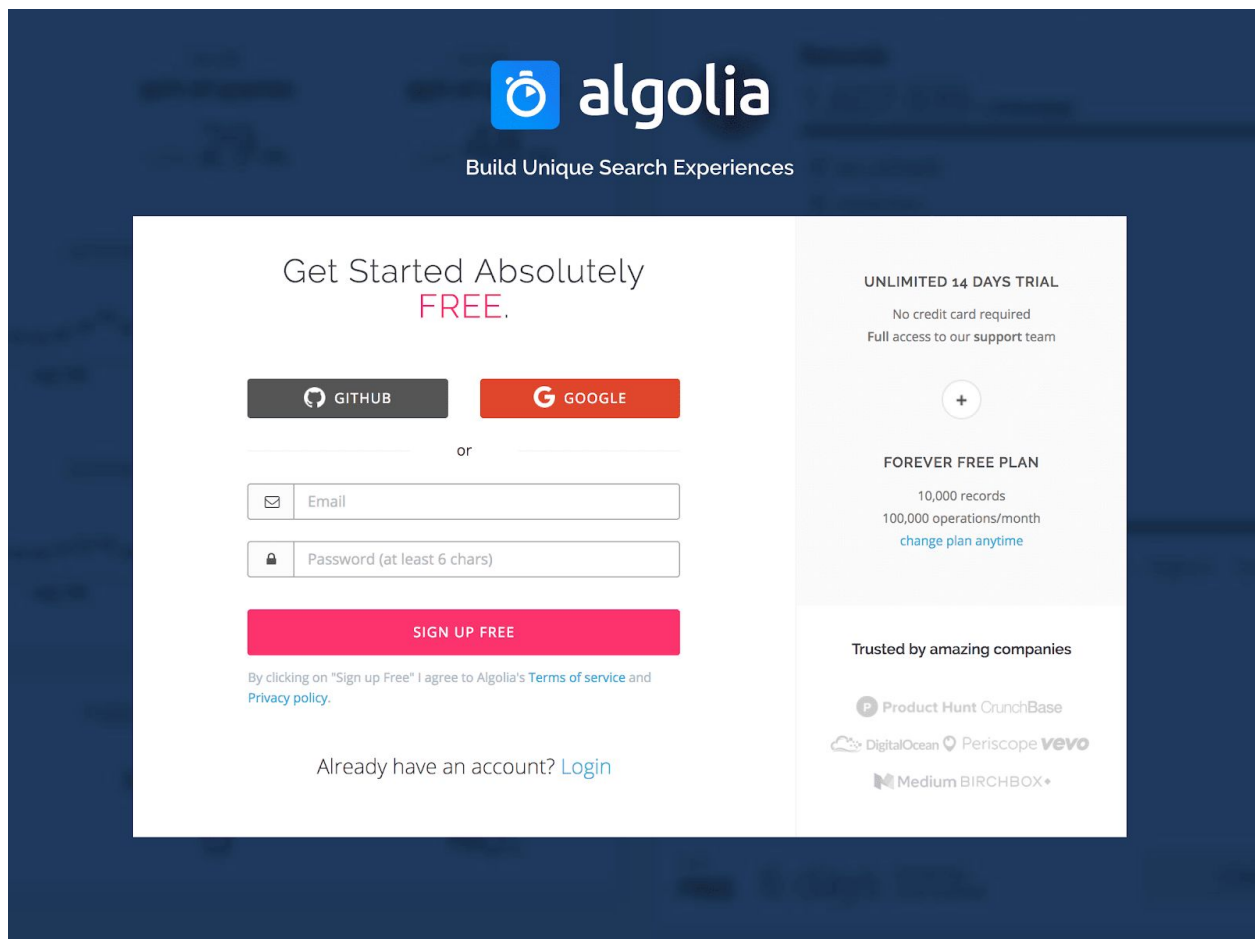


Getting Started

Create an Algolia account

1. Create your [Algolia](#) account. The [sign-up wizard](#) will guide you through Algolia's onboarding process. Pay extra attention to choosing your Algolia datacenter. Select the one which is the closest to your datacenter.
2. Once you are logged into dashboard, get your Algolia credentials from the "Credentials" left-menu.



Install the extension

There are two ways how to install the extension:

1) Magento Marketplace

Navigate to [Magento Marketplace](#) and get the extension. After that navigate to your Magento administration and install the extension by following [this awesome guide](#).

2) Composer

```
$ composer require algolia/algoliasearch-magento-2
$ bin/magento module:enable Algolia_AlgoSearch
$ bin/magento setup:upgrade
$ bin/magento setup:static-content:deploy
```

Configure Algolia credentials

When you have the extension installed, navigate to **Stores > Configuration > Algolia Search** administration panel.

There locate **Credentials & Setup** tab and configure your Algolia credentials:

Enable Indexing <small>[store view]</small>	Yes	▼
	If set to No, Algolia extension will simply be disabled.	
Enable Search <small>[store view]</small>	Yes	▼
	If set to No, search will be done by Algolia but rendered by Magento	
Enable Logging <small>[store view]</small>	Yes	▼
	NOTICE: Debug logging generates a significant amount of data and can affect performance of indexing	
Application ID <small>[store view]</small>	<input type="text"/>	
	Your Application ID, which can be found in the Credentials section of your Algolia account.	
Search-only (public) API key <small>[store view]</small>	<input type="text"/>	
	A search-only API key (will be included in the public JavaScript code)	
Admin API key <small>[store view]</small>	<input type="text"/>	
	Your administration API key (kept private)	
Index Name Prefix <small>[store view]</small>	magento2_	
	If configured, all indices created by the Algolia search extension will be prefixed by this value.	
Enable Auto-completion Menu <small>[store view]</small>	Yes	▼
	If set to Yes, the search box will display a search-as-you-type drop-down menu. It requires your theme to expose a <code>top.search</code> and <code>content</code> block.	

Initial indexing

Force the re-indexing of all sections you want to synchronize with Algolia. In your console run command:

```
$ bin/magento indexer:reindex algolia_products algolia_categories  
algolia_pages algolia_suggestions algolia_additional_sections
```

This command will trigger reindexing on all your content.
