

McAfee SECURE Installation Guide

1. Add McAfee SECURE as a dependency by adding the following line to `composer.json` located under your Magento root folder (e.g. `/var/www/magento`).

```
"mcafeesecure/module-mcafeesecure": "~0.0.5",
```

Your `composer.json` should look something like this:

2. Run `composer update`

3. Enable McAfee SECURE extension by adding the following line to `app/etc/config.php` located under your Magento root folder

```
'McAfeeSecure_McAfeeSecure' => 1,
```

Your `config.php` should now look like this:

```
98 'Magento_Version' => 1,  
99 'Magento_Webapi' => 1,  
100 'Magento_Weee' => 1,  
101 'Magento_CatalogWidget' => 1,  
102 'Magento_Wishlist' => 1,  
103 'McAfeeSecure_McAfeeSecure' => 1,

```

4. Run `bin/magento setup:upgrade`

5. Once the McAfee SECURE extension is enabled. Go to your Magento admin backend to activate your McAfee SECURE account.
