1. Introduction

This extension that comes out of Sambolek labs makes it easier for merchants to display links to their CMS pages in top navigation menu that usually displays only categories. It also provides flexibility in terms to the position of the CMS page link - a merchant can pick a position relative to a category already being displayed in top navigation menu.



2. Installation

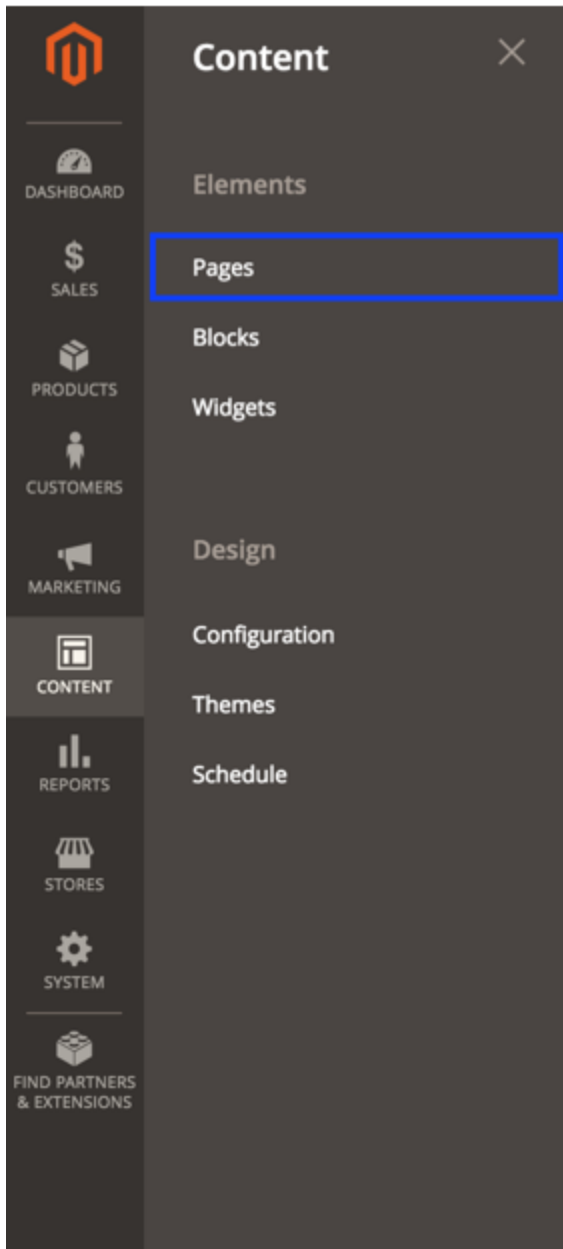
This extension can be installed via:

1. Copying extension contents into app/code folder of your Magento 2 installation
2. Component manager


3. Adding a CMS page to menu

To add a CMS page to menu, follow these steps:

1. open your Magento 2 administration and navigate to “Content->Pages” section




2. Edit any page by clicking “Select” text in “Action” column, and pressing “Edit”.

3. Under “Menu” section, a set of options will appear.

4. Switch “Include in Menu” to “Yes” to have that CMS page appear in top navigation.

5. Save the page and see it appear in your site's top navigation, alongside categories.



4. Add to menu options

There are multiple options you can select.

1. Include in menu
 - Adds the CMS page to top menu
2. Menu label
 - Sets a label for menu item. You can choose to have a menu link title to be different than your CMS page title. This option falls back to CMS page title, if the option is left blank
3. Add to menu
 - Add CMS page link before or after certain category. You can choose between two options:
 - Before
 - Adds CMS page before selected category
 - After
 - Adds CMS page after selected category
4. Before/After category
 - Select a category to which you would like to tie your CMS page to.
